Yee-haw!!! Were you able to attend the January General Membership Meeting and learn about the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Volunteer Program? Thanks to three of our CRLC members, Jeanne Dorow, Barbara Meurer, and Jill Coble who are also volunteers with the Rodeo for presenting our program. We learned there are 110 different committees so something for everyone. Each shared about the committee they are on and the process for becoming a volunteer. Thanks also to 1st VP Beth Clark for sharing history of the Rodeo. The rodeo was started in 1932 and named the Houston Fat Stock Show and Livestock Exposition. The show name was changed to the current name in 1961. In 2023, the Show's general attendance exceeded 2.4 million. The 20-day tournament-style competition has a total payout of \$2,178,000 with each champion awarded \$50,000 plus previous round winnings, a custom made saddle and belt buckle, and an invitation to compete at the rodeo the following year.

You won't want to miss our February General Membership Meeting. Our program will be How do we make sure we have our "affairs in order" presented by CRLC member Georgia Barker. This topic applies to both married and single ladies so make sure you attend.

I hope to see you at some of the upcoming February events. I know our sub club leaders have another outstanding month of activities planned for us.

CRLC was happy to award Reining Strength Therapeutic Horsemanship \$4,200 from funds raised at our December Luncheon, Fashion Show and Fundraising event. Reining Strength's mission is "By partnering with horses, they help people realize their individual potential through customized equineassisted services" for people ages 2 and up - children and adults - who have physical, cognitive, social, or emotional needs. The program focus is two-fold: teaching riding skills and incorporating potential therapeutic benefits into the riding lesson.

Reining Strength Therapeutic Horsemanship is a Premier Accredited Center through the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship, International (PATH Intl.). Their facility is located on 7126 FM 359 Road in Richmond, Texas.





The Boaz House

CRLC was happy to award a check to The Boaz House for \$4,200 from funds raised at our December Luncheon, Fashion Show and Fundraising event. The Boaz House is a six month faith-based women's rehab facility. They help women find restoration in learning to rely on the holy spirit along with working a thorough recovery program. With the guidance of God, they help women find freedom from the bondage of sin. Their program provides a racially, ethnically and culturally diverse therapeutic community that is well-suited for women who are serious about recovery. Their residents live in a highly-structured and highly-supervised, drug and alcohol-free environment. The daily routine has been carefully designed to promote maximum personal responsibility and accountability. This unique community environment also nurtures peer support by providing an avenue for recovering addicts and alcoholics to share emotional, social and practical help with each other.
