October Bonus Event

Our Bonus Trip on Wednesday, September 25, 2024, took 12 of us to the National Funeral Museum in North Houston, followed by a delicious lunch at Pappa's Seafood. As usual for our Bonus trips, we took the Precinct 4 bus driven by our wonderful driver, Karen.

The Museum, which encompasses over 35,000 sq. ft., was beautiful and very informative. We learned so much from our knowledgeable Docent, Karen, about Presidential funerals and the procedures leading up to them. Did you know that on the date any President is sworn in, a 500-600 page binder is started with the President's funeral requests, the procedures needed, guests to be invited, the type of coffin the President wants, food to be served at the reception following the service, and so much more.

We learned about cremation, saw beautiful urns from all around the world; the embalming process (President Lincoln was the first President to be embalmed); all of the Presidential assignations and how they were handled; the Presidential trains used (Lincoln was also the first to taken on a train in his coffin to his burial site); we saw many beautiful and detailed coffins, one of which was built for a family of three, but was never used. After touring the Museum, we all shopped at the Museum Gift Shop.

You could spend all day at the Museum and still may not see everything! If you have not been to the Museum yet, we highly recommend it!!!



News from the Gardening Sub Club-


Hello gardening friends! Let's do a quick recap of this month's garden club. We started with a meet and greet and had fun catching up with friends old and new. Then we met in the sunroom and listened to the sounds played by the ornamental ginger plant. Here is a link to more information about this plant. https://www.thespruce.com/flowering-ginger-plants-1315760

The device we used is called a plantwave. https://plantwave.com/

This device converts electrical conductivity of plants into music. It reads the micro fluctuations in plants which are similar to a polygraph machine used on humans. Yes, plants do communicate! There are 2 books I recommend if you want to go deep diving into the subject. There are many others too.

The Revolutionary Genius of Plants, by Stephano Mancuso https://a.co/d/5C81UZL and Plant Spirit Healing, by Pam Montgomery https://a.co/d/4qnTZk1

The program that was given was on paper towel gardening and how to place and set up your garden. Focused on vegetables but the same applied for annuals and perennials. The first step was tracking the sun, either by watching the sun for a day and noting where the shadows are in your yard or using the free app called SunCalc. That ap lets you plug in your address and see where, when, and how much sun your yard gets. We discussed the amount of sunlight plants really need to photosynthesis enough sugar.



Then we learned a little about square foot gardening and an easy way to plan out our gardens using seeds or transplants. For example, if you are growing carrots, they need to be placed up front in your garden so that other plants do not shade them by blocking out the sun. We fold the paper towel into 16 squares and use nontoxic school glue to glue at least 2 or 3 seeds down in the middle of each square. When we are ready to plant, we place the paper towel with our seeds on it on top of the soil and water it's in. Then poke or cover with solid to the required seed depth. If you are using transplants you cut X's in the paper towel, place, wet, and plant.

We learned how to read a seed packet. We found how much sun, depth of seed, planting Zone (we are zone 9), water requirements, and harvest time. Harvesting on time gives you better jucier veggies.

Afterwards we did a garden tour and discussed herbs and how to harvest them.

Questions that were asked:

- 1. What can we grow now? Acorn squash, Artichokes, Arugula, asparagus, banana peppers, beans, basil, beets, bell peppers, bok choy, broccoli, cabbage, brussel sprouts, carrots, cauliflower, catnip, calendula, celery, chamomile, chickpeas, chives, cilantro, corn, cucumbers, dill, eggplant, garlic, ginger, fennel, kale, lettuce, mint, peas, potatoes, pumpkins, spinach, zucchini, tomatoes, turnips, zinnia, watermelon
- 2. How do you get your poinsettia to turn red?
